On June 23 members of the PA Coalition for Mercury-Free Dentistry protested the use of mercury fillings at a free dental clinic for underserved Pennsylvanians co-sponsored by the University of Pennsylvania Dental School (UPENN) and the Academy of General Dentistry (AGD).

I called AGD's Chicago office to inquire if they were aware of the [2009 Philadelphia City Council Ordinance](#) requiring dentists who remove or place amalgams to give their patients an [informed consent fact sheet](#) advising of the health risks of amalgam. Srin Varaderan, AGD's legislative director of advocacy and events knew nothing of the Philadelphia law and requested that I forward the documents. I then spoke with the PA AGD director who knew of the bill, but had misconceptions relative to its distribution requirements.

As a result of my communication with AGD, the Academy assured that they would uphold the Philadelphia bill requiring signed informed consent. I received the following e-mail from AGD's Chicago office confirming their promise:

Freya,

“You will be pleased to know that we have consulted with Dr. Kotch, Assistant Dean of Clinical Operations, UPenn School of Dental Medicine, and I assure you and confirm that UPenn always has and will continue to adhere to City Council's ordinance that requires that every patient be given the information sheet designed by the City Council before the start of treatment and before deciding on the filling material to be used for that patient. Only after the information on the form has been discussed between the licensed dentist and the patient, understood by the patient, and signed by the patient will the patient make any decision regarding what material he or she wishes to be used. Our doctors and staff are volunteering for the event because they genuinely care about these patients and will always act in the best interest of the patients.” Srin

I also wanted to be certain that composites would be available at no additional charge. I received the following from AGD: “Freya, [It will be free of charge as well. All services will be free of charge.](#)” Thanks, Srin

AGD member, Dr Vincent "Vinny" Mayher, Haddonfield, NJ was the AGD outreach representative for the event. You may recall, Dr. Mayher testified at the 2010 FDA amalgam hearing on behalf of the AGD, wherein he stated that that the majority of U.S. dentists prefer composite fillings, as he does in his private practice. Dr. Mayher failed to take into account the thousands of patients who are treated at dental clinics where the standard of care is mercury amalgam fillings, including treatment for pregnant women and children.

I invited IAOMT member [Steve Markus DDS](#) of Haddon Heights, NJ to participate in the June 23 event, but he was unavailable. Dr. Markus called Dr. Mayher who convinced him that the free clinic was not an appropriate venue for our protest. In turn Dr. Mayher sent me an e-mail suggesting that we were on the page, and we should speak if I cancel the protest. As I explained to the doctors, the protest was against the use of mercury fillings not the free dental clinic. If we had not intervened and educated those needing dental care at the clinic they wouldn't have known that silver fillings were 50% mercury, that mercury fillings are a health risk or that they had a choice of a non-mercury composite at no extra charge. Please take the time to read [Dr. Mayher's e-mail](#) to me (attached).

In Dr. Mayher's FDA testimony has stated that "...the vast majority of dentists in private practice, myself included, place tooth colored composites as their restorative material of choice" and "... most dentists in private practice prefer composites or glass ionomers for restorations in children's teeth. Based on his statement and his letter to me, I suggest a collaborative effort between IAOMT and AGD to educate it's members about the benefits of adopting IAOMT's safe protocol for amalgam removal.

Irate consumer is shocked to learn that mercury fillings are still being used. She had hers removed years ago, but admits not safely.

In speaking with those participating in the clinic as patients, we learned that a small minority knew of the dangers of mercury fillings, but the vast majority were horrified. One such father was outraged that his under 6 year old child had received mercury fillings at the UPENN clinic without informed consent, one woman with a mouthful of amalgams had recently been diagnosed with Lupus and questioned the onset of the disease since there was no family history of Lupus, and several men with many mercury fillings were upset because they were denied treatment due to high blood pressure, yet there was no mention by the dentists of the possible connection between their fillings and their heart condition.
